

2018 Plymouth Motor Club Scatter Series Regulations

Welcome to Plymouth Motor Club's Scatter Rally series which will consist of five rounds as listed below. For more information or entries contact the Series Co-ordinator, James Ellison by phone on 075 333 91 272 or by e-mail at Jamesellison@appliedautomation.co.uk, or the Club Facebook page.

Invited Clubs:

Only Paid up Members of Plymouth Motor Club can enter an event.

Dates of events:

9th February, 9th March, 8th June, 12th October, 9th November 2018.

Scoring:

A competitor's best Four scores will count towards their final score. Points will be scored as follows:- 1st place – 20 points, 2nd place – 18 points, 3rd place – 16 points, 4th place – 14 points, 5th place – 12 points, all other finishers will score 10 points. Non finishers will score 5 points for starting, organisers will score 19 points. (In the event of Tie when Drop scores are applied, All the Scores will count. In the event that it is still Tied then the Overall results will be deemed a Tie.)

Series Awards.

The 1st and 2nd placed driver and 1st & 2nd placed navigator will be presented with awards at the Plymouth Motor Club Awards Presentation Evening, (2nd Place awards are subject to their being 5 or more Contenders during the year.)

Event Regulations

Entries

The entry fee will be £12 per vehicle. Single person entries will be accepted but you can only score points as either a driver or a navigator, not both, which you will need to nominate before the event.

Entries must be made to the Series Co-ordinator. Entries will be accepted up to the start of the Event subject to 3 Entries being received by the Series Coordinator by 9:00pm on the Monday before the Event.

If 3 Entries are not received by the Co-ordinator by 9:00pm on the Monday before the Event the Event will not Run.

Events

All events will consist of either twenty, twenty-four, or twenty-eight map references placed in an Approximate Area of 14 x 14 Grid squares, (or equivalent area). These places will be on easily recognisable points, for example junctions or, bridges, cattle grids, car parks or lay-bys. At each point you will be looking for a part or full car number plate. These will all be attached to wood. You will be required to record the characters from the number plate and whatever (if anything) has been added to it. You may also have to answer a question about the number plate. You must only visit a Maximum of 75% of the places you are given, once you have done so you should go to the finish venue. (You may not have time to visit all the locations). There is no set route that you have to follow on these events, it is up to you to decide where to go & how to get there. You will be informed before the start how the event will be scored. The organiser of the event will mark the event & their decision is final. The winner or highest placed finisher who has yet to organise an event will organise the next event, you will only have organise one Scatter event in 2018.

The Time allowed for each event will be between 1.5 and 2.5 hours and aiming to finishing by 10:15pm.

A maximum finish time will be stated in the event handouts or at the start.

The Maximum number of Entries will be 12 Cars, The minimum number is 3.

Awards

The 1st placed driver and 1st placed navigator will be presented with an award at the Plymouth Motor Club Awards Presentation Evening.
